# BARLESTONE ST. GILES RESERVES

Barlestone St Giles Football Club formed in 1958. Originally a church team, the club played on land off Barton Road Barlestone and used the former village hall on Barton road as changing rooms.

In the late 1970's players formed a social committee, and a social club was built from funds raised by the local players and in partnership with a local brewery. The club proved very popular but during the 1980's disaster struck when subsidence from the nearby Bagworth colliery caused damage to the clubhouse and the pitch. A new clubhouse was constructed, and repairs made to the pitch and St Giles were back on track.

In 2003 David Wilson purchased the club house and land, farmland was purchased to the immediate north of the existing pitch, and a new facility was opened in 2005. After several management changes the club is now going strong, even in these trying times. We have an active membership of over 500 and our club house is open every evening in the week and all-day Saturdays and Sundays. We host numerous entertainment events, show live sports and hold community activities throughout the year.
